


- 30. (B) Milkha Singh, also known as The Flying Sikh, has been honoured with the 2017 Maruti Suzuki Living Legend of the Year award at the 6th edition of 'Maruti Suzuki Sportsperson of the Year' Charity Gala Awards on July 6, 2017 at ITC Grand Central in, Mumbai, Maharashtra.
- 32. (D) In humans, glycogen is made and stored primarily in the cells of the liver and the muscles, hydrated with three or four parts of water. Muscle glycogen is converted into glucose by muscle cells, and liver glycogen converts to glucose for use throughout the body including the central nervous system.
- 33. (C) Antoine Henri Becquerel was a French physicist, Nobel laureate, and the first person to discover evidence of radioactivity.
- 34. (C) Nicolaus Copernicus was a Renaissance mathematician and astronomer who formulated a model of the universe that placed the Sun rather than the Earth at the center of the universe.
- 35. (C) Tianhe-I is a supercomputer capable of an Rmax (maximum range) of 2.5 petaFLPS. Located at the National Supercomputing Centre of Tianjin, China it was the fastest computer in the world from October 2010 and is one of the few Petascale supercomputer in the world.
- 37. (C) The traditional festival Kut of the Mizos is celebrated across the north-eastern state of Mizo-inhabited areas in the neighbouring states. It is a spring festival celebrated during March after completion of their most arduous task of Jhum operation i.e., jungle clearing of the remmants of burning) with great fervour and gaiety.
- 38. (C) The Indian Councils Act 1909, commonly known as the Morley-Minto Reforms was an Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom that brought about a limited increase in the involvement of Indians in the governance of British India. John Morley, the Liberal Secretary of State for India, and the Conservative Viceroy of India.
- 40. (B) Child Marriage Restraint Act 1929, passed on 28 September 1929 in the British India Legislature of India, fixed the age of marriage for girls at 14 years and boys at 18 years which was later

amended to 18 for girls and 21 for boys. It is popularly known as the Sarda Act, after its sponsor Harbilas Sarda.

- 41. (B) Thermal capacity is the amount of heat that is required in order to raise the temperature by 1°C
- 42. (D) Anti-Defection Law is contained in the Tenth Schedule of the Constitution, which was introduced by the 52nd Amendment in 1985 during tenure of Rajiv Gandhi Earlier, 10th schedule was related to association of Sikkim with India. Once, Sikkim became fledged state, this schedule was repealed via the 36th amendment act.
- 43. (C) K G Karmakar and Gauri Shankar have been appointed as new Independent Directors of India Post Payments Bank (IPPB). The Appointments Committee of the Cabinet has approved their appointment to the post on the board of directors of the bank for a period of 3 years. The IPPB has been incorporated as a public sector bank under the Department of Posts with 100% equity of the Government of India (GoI).
- 45. (B) The National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) has conducted its first-of-its-kind State-level mock exercise on forest fire in Uttarakhand on April 18, 2017.The mock exercise was part of a three-day event which began with a Co-ordination Conference on April 18, 2017, followed by a Tabletop Exercise on April 19, 2017. The mock exercise has been conducted in collaboration with the State Government.
- 47. (D) Antonie Philips van Leeuwenhoek was a Dutch businessman, scientist, and one of the notable representatives in the golden age of Dutch science and technology. A largely self-taught man in science, he is commonly known as the father of Microbiology, and often field of microscopy and for the contributions towards the establishment of microbiology of as a scientific discipline.
- 48. (C) National Rural Employment Guarantee Act 2005 was later renamed as the "mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act" (or, MGNREGA), is an Indian labour law and social security measure that aims to guarantee the 'right to work'.
- 49. (A) The Factory Act of 1891 in India was enacted to improve the condition of
